Ethylene Oxide Steriliser to KEM Hospital, Parel, Mumbai

An Ethylene Oxide (ETO) Sterilizer was handed over to the Cardiology Department of KEM Hospital, Parel, Muymbai in mid-May 2016. This equipment is used to sterilize catheters and equipment used in cardiac care that need dry sterilisation. It is estimated that the equipment will benefit a few hundred needy patients. The project was coordinated by the Rotary Club of Mumbai Mahim.

The handover ceremony was attended by the Hospital's Medical Team and Staff headed by the Hospital Dean Dr Avinash Supe, who expressed his satisfaction at the donation, and cited the 'family' bond that thyssenkrupp Industrial Solutions (India) had developed with KEM, on account of the CSR donations, over the past 2 years.

Dr Supe's sentiments were echoed by other doctors of the Cardiology Department of the Hospital, as they dwelt on the emotional aspects involved in such donations, their untold reach to the needier sections of society, and the sense of awareness for such needs, that these acts help generate.

Critical Care Equipment to the Sassoon General Hospital, Pune

A Video Gastroscope and a Fibreoptic Bronchoscope were handed over to the Endoscopy Department and the Anesthesia Department of the Sassoon General Hospital in Pune in May 2016. It is estimated that the equipment will benefit some 8,000 plus needy patients on an ongoing basis.

The project was initiated and coordinated by the Rotary Club of Pune, Hillside.

The Fibreoptic Bronchoscope is used in the visual examination of the breathing passages of the lungs, in cases of difficult intubation, as well as for obtaining samples of mucus of tissues from the lungs.

The Video Gastroscope is used in the visual examination of the stomach and duodenum, and is helpful in diagnosing various diseases like ulcers and varices.

Computers to the Canossa High School, Mahim, Mumbai

Canossa High School is a convent school for girls, administered by the Canossian Daughters of Charity. More than 2,000 girls study at the Day School and 400 plus students avail of the Night School facilities. The School also caters to the underprivileged girls from Dharavi Slums, making tkIS India's donation of the 70 computers, a value-addition to the School's academic offering

'I am honored to receive this updated set of computers for our Computer Lab,' said Sr Margaret Sequeira, the School Principal in her address, adding that the old set of computers, which were also in working condition, would be sent to the School's Mission schools in the Dahanu and Valsad regions. 'The computers will help us in ensuring that all our girls become computer literate.'

Neuro Surgery and Critical Care Equipment to the Tata Memorial Hospital

tkIS India continued its CSR initiatives for the year 2015-2016 by donating critical-care medical equipment to the Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai. The equipment include a **Cortical Stimulator & Nerve Monitoring System** to the Neurosurgery Department, an **Ultrasonic Aspirator** to the Neurosurgery & Surgical Gastroenterology Department and a **Thromboelastograph Analyser** to the Anaesthesia & Critical Care Department. The Rotary Club of Mumbai Mahim helped identify and coordinate the project.

Each equipment is expected to benefit around 300-400 patients at the Hospital.

Dr. Anil D’Cruz, Director, Tata Memorial Hospital in his speech thanked tkIS India for its sustained contributions over 2 years. “Donations such as these are extremely important as they greatly increase the chances of success in operations,” he said. He went on to explain that the Hospital looks forward to the funding of such equipment, as grants for such equipment are hard to come by for the Hospital. “We are blessed to have your support,” he concluded.

Replying to Dr Cruz after handing over the Donation Agreement papers, **Mr. P. D. Samudra, Managing Director, tkIS India**, thanked the Hospital for the opportunity to serve Society. ‘Your work has a far bigger impact on society compared to what we do,’ said Mr Samudra, remarking how honoured he and the tkIS India team felt whenever they visited the Hospital, and saw the work being done by the doctors and nursing staff.
